


Welcome to St Barnabas Church

In your prayers this week please take time to pray for:

- ⇒ our hospitals and health systems and all who work in them, and for all those who work in emergency services and disaster recovery for safety from infection or injury, for adequate times of rest and restoration, and for wisdom and compassion in all their dealing;
- ⇒ those who work in schools and the students they teach, especially for Orange Anglican Grammar School and Orange Christian School, that the love of Christ and the gospel of his grace will be evident in all they do;
- ⇒ High School SRE (Scripture classes) at Orange and Canobolas High Schools and at Molong Central School, and for Ian Gilbert who teaches classes at those schools; pray especially for the visit of Christian band, *Amber Lights*, to all three schools in September, that this will create opportunities for students to return to SRE classes in the following weeks;
- ⇒ our churchwardens, parish council, staff and others who hold positions of leadership at St Barney's, that they will continue to grow in godliness, fulfil their responsibilities with wisdom and grace, and always keep the gospel foremost in all they do;
- ⇒ pray especially for the parish council as they engage in renewed discussion about our future direction following the congregational forums that were completed last week;
- ⇒ the parish of Coonabarabran, currently without a pastor that God will strengthen and encourage their leaders and all who serve in the church, that they may grow in love for Jesus and each other; that those who attend occasionally will come to know the hope that is found in Jesus; that lives will be changed and many hearts opened to hear the gospel;
- ⇒ ARDFA (Anglican Relief and Development Fund Australia), Compassion Australia and IJM (International Justice Mission) that the Lord will richly resource them through the generous giving of his people, so that they can assist the most vulnerable and disadvantaged, ministering to both body and spirit;
- ⇒ those who are ill, injured, lonely, sorrowing, recovering or in any other need, especially those known to us or for whom our prayers have been asked, including Cinda and Anni.

Could you teach Primary School children about God?

Please read and prayerfully consider this message from Robyn Sommerlad who heads up the multi-denominational team which coordinates Primary SRE (Scripture) in Orange.

We praise God that every SRE class in all 14 Public Schools in Orange has a teacher this year. About 1500 children are hearing of God's love for them, and the good news of Jesus, every week!

In 2026 we will be needing at least 5 more SRE teachers to cover all classes in our schools. Please consider becoming an SRE teacher, or consider how you can encourage or enable others to become SRE teachers. We also ask for prayer that our need will be met.

Amongst our present SRE teachers some work and teach SRE in their lunch hour; some teach SRE on their day or afternoon off; some have family babysit children so that they can teach; many others are retirees. Perhaps one of these options would work for you or someone you know.

Training is required to become a teacher and Term 3 or 4 is a good time to commence this training. It also gives you time to visit an SRE class. When rostering teachers we try to accommodate the preferences of teachers regarding the day, school and preferred age of students. All teaching materials are provided.
